5. Role of the School Counselor

School Counselors are leaders, advocates and collaborators who impact systemic change.

As a Leader

- As leaders, Owen J. Roberts School counselors develop and maintain a comprehensive counseling program for all students that also involves administrators, staff, parents and outside resources. The counselor acts as a member of leadership teams supporting the building administrator in order to ensure student success and safety, both physically and emotionally.
- Supports school staff and administration to make the school a safe and welcoming place of learning
- Serves on the Student Assistance Team to link students with interventions that improve their social, emotional and academic well-being
- Facilitates group discussions through community meetings about bullying, social learning differences, tolerance and character development
- Participates in the Instructional Support / MTSS / Child Study Teams to remove any barriers in student learning
- Uses data to determine appropriate course placement and aides in the development of a master schedule that accommodates the needs of all students
- Builds relationships with community agencies and programs that support our students

As an Advocator

- Ensures access to educational and career exploration opportunities for all students
- Communicates student needs to parents, administrators and teachers
- Links students and families to appropriate community supports
- Provides support to students and families who are having financial difficulty
- Creates opportunities for students to gain leadership responsibility through Wildcat Ambassador program
- Designs educational programming in such a way that it is clear and accessible for all students
- Teaches students conflict resolution skills
- Provides tools to assist students to make positive behavior changes
- Connecting families with mental health supports
- Provides resources and community connections to meet the basic needs of students and their families outside of school

As a Collaborator

- Promotes commitment to OJR Middle School PRIDE (Promote a caring environment, Responsible for our learning, Interacting collaboratively, Devoted to Challenging our minds and Excellence in all that we do) through PBIS (Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports) and No Place for Hate (Devoted to challenge will be understanding and respect those who are different than me. - Serve as a liaison between Montgomery County Community College and OJR High School to provide students with dual enrollment opportunities, and early college program access
- Work collaboratively with building administrators, students, teachers and parents to provide support with academic planning, including course selection, course recommendations, scheduling and course placement

- Brainstorms alternate action plans for difficult student and/or family problems
- Enlists the help of other educators to pursue changes in programing to best meet the needs of students

Individual Career Plan Goal – OJR High School beginning in the freshman year, students will begin using Naviance for their career and postsecondary planning. OJR Middle School will be using Naviance as well. Our elementary students will be capturing their career artifacts using Google Classroom.

12. Career and Technical Center Strategy

Owen J. Roberts School District works closely with the Technical College High School (TCHS) at the Pickering campus. In our district, students are able to apply to TCHS for the 10th, 11th, and 12th grades. Students are able to attend TCHS on a part-time basis starting their sophomore year of high school. In the 2022-2023 school year, we have 119 part-time TCHS Students. We also have students in the Homeland Security Program through Octorara School District.

13. Essential Duties and Responsibilities of the Counseling Department

This section of the counseling program design establishes those specific activities which supplement the counseling curriculum. The target group is defined as the school community, composed of students, parent(s)/guardian(s), school staff, and outside agencies. Activities listed are provided on an as-needed or requested basis and may be unique to individual buildings. These activities are listed as follows:
